In Mathematics we will be:

- Recognising and comparing fractions of shapes and amounts.
- Adding and subtracting fractions.
- Learning the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, drawing 2D shapes and making models of 3D shapes.
- Recognising angles and turns.
- Identifying horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines
- Measuring, comparing, adding and subtracting measurements (cm, g/kg, ml/l)
- Interpreting and presenting data, using bar chart, pictograms and tables.
- Solving one and two step problems.

- Sewing togas for a teddy
- Designing and making shadow puppets to tell a story
- Creating digital images linked to rivers
- Studying artists that use weaving then use this to support our own weaving work
- Designing and making shelters during Outdoor Week

In Music we will be:

Choosing instruments to compose music to represent the water cycle.
